Project Achieve and Project T.I.E.S. (Transition) Instruction and Employment Support) are postsecondary programs at Florida State College at Jacksonville (FSCJ). The presenters will share supports provided, Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) funding, Individual Educational Plans (IEPs), student selection process and student success stories.

 - Initial time spent is far more than could be continually offered
- Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU)
- District Course Approval
- Mentors in place at beginning

Project ACHIEVE Goal

- Improve the retention and success rate of students with intellectual and other developmental disabilities in career and technical education programs;
- Facilitate a coordinated effort to respond to the specialized needs of these students through a holistic program delivery model; and
- Provide supportive instructional delivery strategies that assist students with program completion.

Project ACHIEVE Goal

Major Solutions

- Development of classroom and on-site continuing education curriculum and hands-on learning including integrated work experiences for students with intellectual disabilities to participate with their nondisabled peers in an inclusive setting;
- Implementation of a customized social and academic support system for students providing meetings/socials, cultural experiences, etc. as well as tutoring and instructional support and mentoring by the Inclusion specialist, job coach support, and the partnering administrators;

Major Solutions

- Creation of an intensive career preparation and career counseling component for students including self-determination activities, orientation activities, career exploration, job readiness skills, etc.;
- Involvement of K-12 education, workforce board, community collaborators, Florida DOE, & industry in designing curriculum for students with intellectual disabilities & providing industry-oriented experiences for students;

Major Solutions

- Construction of a family information/education component of the program educating parents on postsecondary options for students and the development of their transition goals. Parents will attend IEP meetings, attend a mandatory orientation for parents and students, sign release for transportation, meet with job coaches, and attend a parent night on the college campus;
- The College Faculty have received required training needed to best help the Project Achieve students from the Inclusion specialist. Faculty members have received training on a case-by-case basis from the inclusion specialist.

- 2012-2013
 - Project ACHIEVE
 - Students who have met the 6th grade TABE requirement and who have an interest in a career technical program enter Project T.I.E.S.

Student Selection Process

- 2013-2014
 - Spring 2013
 - TABE testing
 - District wide information to schools/parents
 - Transition Specialists/Coaches recruit
 - Application & Interview
 - Collaborative student selection

 - Student cannot have exited the school system with an exit document.
 - Dual Enrollment is not the solution for every student
